## New UEFA National Team Coefficient Ranking System

- ⊗ All official competition matches count (EURO & WC)
- ⊗ Closer picture of teams' strength
  - ⊗ 2.5 competition cycles, e.g. for EURO 2012 final draw
    - UEFA EURO 2008, qualification & final tournament
    - 2010 FIFA World Cup, qualification & final tournament
    - UEFA EURO 2012, qualification
  - ⊗ Calculation
    - Match points, results and goals
    - Bonus points for competition stages
    - Weighting 2-2-1

## Competition System

- ⊗ Group Stage
  - ⊗ 9 group winners and best runner-up qualify directly
    - Best runner-up: results vs 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> ranked teams
  - ⊗ 8 remaining runners-up qualify for the play-offs
- ⊗ Play-off draw
  - ⊗ Seeds: 4 runners-up with best coefficient
  - ⊗ Order of the matches is drawn
- ⊗ Final draw
  - ⊗ 4 seeds: Poland, Ukraine, Spain (if qualified) and one or two teams with the best coefficient

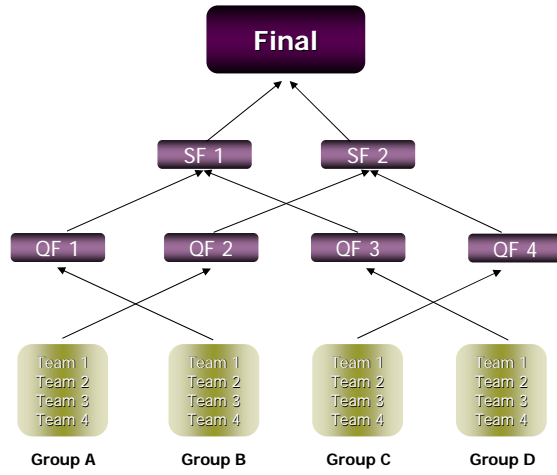

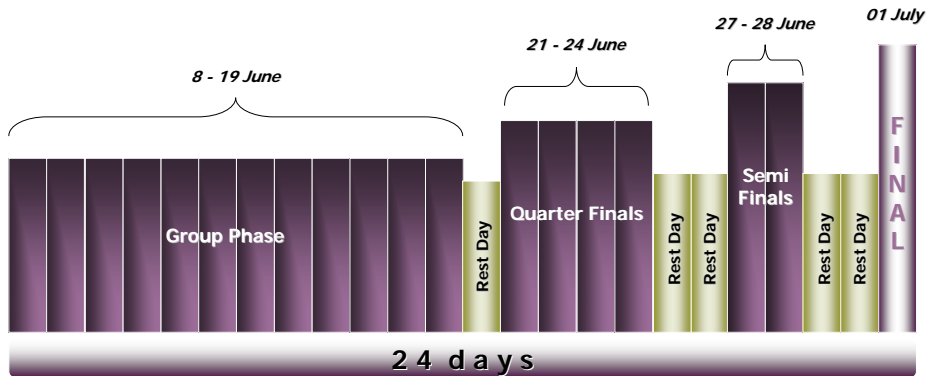
### Final tournament path

  - ⊗ FC Lechia

  - ⊗ WKS Slask Wroclaw

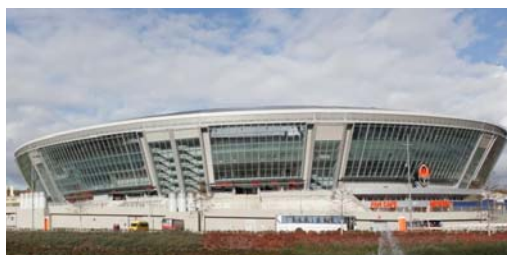

  - ⊗ Ready in June 2011
  - ⊗ National team matches

  - ⊗ Operational since Sept. 2009
  - ⊗ FC Shaktar Donetsk

## Ukraine Venues

- ⊗ Metalist Stadium, Kharkiv
  - ⊗ 35.000 spectators
  - ⊗ Stadium in use, refurbishment completed in October 2010
  - ⊗ Metalist FC

  - ⊗ 32.000 spectators
  - ⊗ Ready in July 2011
  - ⊗ FC Karpaty

  - ⊗ 38 hotels and training grounds
  - ⊗ Booking procedures
    - ⌚ First come, first served
    - ⌚ Firm booking only after final draw

### Final Tournament Team Arrangements

- ⊗ Team to be in Poland-Ukraine at least five days before their first match
- ⊗ Team to be at the venue latest 24 hours before KO
- ⊗ MD-1 press conference and official training session at the match stadium
- ⊗ At least one public training session is mandatory

### Final Tournament Players

- ⊗ List of 23 Players
  - ⊗ Must be presented to UEFA by Tuesday 29 May at the latest, i.e. at least 10 days before the opening match
  - ⊗ Each player must undergo a medical examination, incl. cardiovascular screening
- ⊗ Yellow cards
  - ⊗ Single cautions expire on completion of the quarter-finals
  - ⊗ Cautions and pending yellow-card suspensions expire at the end of the final tournament
